Description

What are the concrete objectives you would like to achieve and outcomes or results you would like to realise? How are these objectives linked to the priorities you have selected?

Throughout the project (18 months) we envisage stimulating social skills in terms of social, emotional, cognitive abilities, involving 42 students from 3 European countries.

The objectives that we aim to achieve are:

- -to increase awareness of social skills among students from 3 EU schools
- -to support the social adaptation of the students during the 18 months long project
- -to encourage peer-to-peer learning
- -to promote the integration of students in a globalized world

Selected objectives and priorities: The social and educational value of the European cultural heritage, its contribution to job creation, economic growth and social cohesion.

The working methods of the project promote the social inclusion of students through peer-to-peer learning. We will encourage students to carry out cultural dialogue at international level, we will encourage students to support each other in their learning process both locally and internationally.

The eTwinning platform will be used to disseminate tangible results of the project, thus integrating into the activities carried out the use of digital tools. Students are used to using gadgets. Our goal is to guide them, to encourage them, to use IT for learning purposes. At the same time, it will bring students closer to their teachers. Teachers will raise awareness and understanding of students and their preferences regarding how to integrate new technologies into teaching.

The concrete results that we seek to produce are questionnaires, the logo and website, the eTwinning project, audiovisual presentations / materials: "Countries and schools", "My culture", "Big people. Big communities, "What is social learning? "," How to combat social exclusion? ", Brochure: Study buddy: common experience, dictionary, great people's calendar, 3D postcards, coloring posters," Cultural diversity "exhibition, play" Heritage " EU of Romania, Turkey and Italy ", book exchange centers, DVD project, e-guide: Practical example to support peer-to-peer learning.

The target group of the project is students aged 14-18 years. The language of communication within the project will be English. The purpose of the project is to communicate the students with the project partners by developing the communication skills in a foreign language. Students will support each other in their learning process to learn more about European cultural heritage, becoming active citizens. They will become aware of other lifestyles, views and approaches to deal with things that will develop their emotional abilities. The students' cognitive abilities will be enhanced by creating the space for social learning experiences.

Please outline the target groups of your project

The target groups to which the project is addressed are:

- -42 students (13-17 years)
- -12 teachers
- -42 students and 12 teachers from all partner schools will participate directly in the project mobilities -15 school personnel (librarian, accountant, psychologist / school counselor)
- 120 families
- -50 representatives of local communities

In all partner institutions, the implementation team will be formed primarily by the Head teacher, contact person and English teacher. They will inform the institution about the project and will recruit participants. The project is open to all school staff and students. The selection of participants will be done taking into account their motivation, interest in the subject as well as their contribution. All those interested will send a letter of intent and will be interviewed.

Participants are encouraged to take part in local activities, to organize activities at the project club and to use the project in teaching. As the subject and the results of the project will be integrated into teaching, more students will benefit from the present project.

In order to promote a sense of belonging to a community, the involved teachers and students will be formed a team under a project club umbrella. Part of the club's activities is the creation of project materials (logo, presentations, etc.), the arrangement of Erasmus + corners and the organization of dissemination activities. Non-formal activities will be organized in which students will use English in a real-life context, as English is the common working language. School psychologists will observe and monitor student behavior during activities. Parents 'associations and parent representatives will be informed about the project during the parents' monthly meetings, school ceremonies and through social media. They will be invited to attend the welcoming ceremony, helping to organize local cultural activities during the hosting meeting. About 100 families will benefit indirectly from the project.

The representatives of the City Hall, stakeholders, educational institutions, school inspectorates, NGOs and the media will be invited to participate in the local dissemination events.

Please describe the motivation for your project and explain why it should be funded

This study aims to promote the potential of peer-to-peer learning are designed as a way to move beyond independent



learning to mutual learning. Teachers from Turkey, Romania, Italy collaborated to carry out this project. The target group of the project is students aged 13-17.

Collaborative work was based on the fact that all partner schools agreed that the project-based teaching method is encouraged in their own education system. Students are required to create projects at the end of each chapter close, to all the subjects studied. Being identified, we decided to exploit this common point, we proposed to bring together students from partner countries to work together and to support each other with the aim of promoting cooperative and peer-to-peer learning. We believe that peer-to-peer learning will help students learn effectively, develop social skills and abilities, however they learn from each other during their daily activities. In each partner school a SWOT analysis was performed to identify the needs. Comparing the SWOT results came to a common conclusion: the need to increase the quality of education, the responsibility of students for their own learning, the need to reduce discrimination and aggressive behavior. Analyzing the behavior of the students we have come to the conclusion that in all partner schools the students tend to disrespect and reject the point of view of others, they lack empathy and they are aggressive with each other. The percentage of acts of violence is 20% in Turkey, 25% in Italy and 29% in Romania.

Our project wants to respond to the identified needs by developing the social competences of the students in terms of social, emotional and cognitive skills necessary for a successful social adaptation.

The need to continue such an international project is motivated by the fact that working in an international team will create situations in which the social interaction of students from peer to peer will develop them emotionally, cognitively at European level.

We believe that peer-to-peer learning is an underutilized resource, especially in our times, when students seem to be one step ahead of us. The teachers of the present generation, we must keep up with the new tendencies and needs of our students, orient their formation, reduce the generation of goals.

This project should be funded because it uses an innovative approach to the topic of peer to peer learning, using digital tools and direct interaction with colleagues in different countries. Meeting the participants with a different social and cultural context, their involvement in activities that stimulate the social and educational value of the European cultural heritage will promote the social inclusion and cohesion of the group, values promoted by ET 2021. The EU values mentioned in Article 2 of the EU Treaty are promoted internationally.

How does the project address the needs and goals of the participating organisations and the identified needs of their target groups?

Within the project we have planned 3 transnational meetings which will be with students. 2 virtual on-line meetings are planned. The proposed activities consider peer to peer learning and cooperative learning approach. In designing the activities in the middle of the attention was the way of thinking of the students, in order to train valuable young people. Each activity is designed to help make our students understand that we are all human, that diversity is one of the beauties of humanity, and that mutual support will blossom us all, transforming us into better people. The activities will lead step by step to the main objective of the project. Students in international working groups will be exposed to other points of view in approaching a particular topic, which will increase their cognitive abilities. Their social skills will be developed during cultural activities.

For the involvement of students at local and international level, project clubs will be created, in each partner school, to those who wish to join. Within the project groups will create Erasmus corners, audiovisual presentations / materials will be made, they will participate in eTwinning activities and they will participate in dissemination events. Each student involved in the club will develop their personal skills according to their own timeline.

Social-emotional development includes students' experience, expression and emotional management, as well as their ability to establish positive and satisfying relationships with their peers. We planned workshops with the focus of working together creatively and on encouraging students to express themselves, the results of the students' collaborative work. Each partner school will create one book exchange center, which will involve local and international participants. During the transnational meetings each student will receive a booklet: The study buddy. The booklet will be created during the first project meeting, and will be used as a tool to encourage students to share common experiences and raise awareness of other points of view. This tool will be based on the initial questionnaires applied at the school level and taking into account the interests of the students. Students will receive this booklet at the beginning of each visit, it will be like a diary they must fill in with a colleague from the host country. The basic characteristics of social and emotional development include the ability to identify and understand one's feelings, to manage personal emotions, to express them in a constructive way and to develop empathy for others. As it will be necessary to support each other in recognizing that each person is responsible for their own learning process, we have planned interactive activities to support students in developing social and emotional perspectives.

What will be the benefits of cooperating with transnational partners to achieve the project objectives?

The fundaments of the designed activities through the project are:

A productive and efficient project management;

A close collaboration with the partners;

The receptiveness towards all types of communication between partners;

A clear communication line between all the involved parts;

Clear prediction and traceability of responsibilities, duties and activities assigned to the participants;

Summing up the total of activities according to the 18 months work plan;



Having time and the budget as the fundamental lines of establishing objectives in school;

Maintaining a close relationship with the beneficiaries and families;

Setting up an online evaluation and report meeting at the end of each six months in order to assess the activities` qualitative aspects and their impact on the targeted segment of students;

Indicators:

Very clear observations will be gathered, both written and recorded from the early stages of the project in order to observe the goal of at least 65% of the involved students manifesting positive outcomes;

The total of 54 participants will receive a 18 months attendance certificate;

Testing regarding social inclusion, improving life skills and developing tolerance education will be carried out by the participants at the beginning and end of the project to offer a comparative result concerning the accumulated knowledge in this field. The expected result is an increase of 80% related to this specific matter;

The number of parents, teachers, stakeholders, psychologists and therapists involved in this project will reach the number of at least 400 people.

The number of non-partnership schools included in the e – Twinning project will also be considered and will have to cover a minimum number of 5 schools.

Encouraging the increase of reading and downloading the materials (lesson plans and handbook of cultural diversity in education) that will be uploaded on the project website and social media sites.

Obtaining at least 80% satisfactory result in applying a survey to the participants of all partner schools, families and beneficiaries taking part in the project activities;

Disseminating the project's outcomes through sending the compiled lesson plans to the local/national schools (at least 80 for each educational institution) and also to the families with children with disabilities covering at least 90%, while also taking the same measure regarding all the institutions dealing with special education at local/regional level;

Requesting a permanent feedback (positive or negative) from all the participants attending all the stages and activities in the project;

Monitoring and analyzing all the improvement noticeable in the mental, emotional, social, motor, physical performance of the students;
